


THE GRADUAL

PASTOR The New Testament Bible Reading comes from Hebrews chapter 12, beginning there in the 18th verse.




The New Testament Bible Reading


THE SERMON

THE BIBLE READINGS

The Old Testament Reading for the 14th Sunday after Pentecost

Isaiah 66:18-23 In this last chapter of the book, the prophet Isaiah points to the glory of the New Testament Church, gathered out of all nations. It's the glory of God's Kingdom which we have already entered through Jesus Christ by faith. Soon comes our final delivery when we will always be praising the LORD. We read...
